



### **Program Introduction**

In an effort to expand the Cub Scout program, we are offering an opportunity for Cub Scout camping to return to Scouting the Zoo. This is the result of many hours of discussion and analysis with Cub Scout leaders and event planning specialists. The history of Scouting the Zoo is a very long one and we are hoping this program will continue to grow not only participation, but the overall culture of the event. The event leadership would like to welcome you to this opportunity.

Due to the complex nature of Scouting the Zoo, we offer the application process to be sure those interested in camping are from both active and program-minded packs. If the pilot program goes well, we are hoping the Cub Scout camping program will expand and become a fixture (and no longer an application-based option) of the event.

### The Application

The application includes questions to gauge a unit's outdoor program and previous participation at Scouting the Zoo. There are no "right" or "wrong" answers and each has been chosen for a reason. You will find a few questions about expected participation. These questions will help us understand the potential footprint of your pack in activities and camping. A summer camp promotion is also required so we know your unit supports the summer camp program or is interested in hearing more about it.

We also want to give you an opportunity to share your thoughts. The entire leadership team cares deeply for the event and can understand all sorts of concerns and we want to hear yours.

The last portion of the application outlines several agreements that we are asking of all packs accepted to the pilot program. We hope all packs will attend the informational meeting on April 10, 2018 but it is required for all units selected for the camping pilot program. We will discuss the camping rules and explain the timing of the weekend as it pertains to campsite setup. It is also required of each unit to have properly trained leadership in outdoor activities. This will ensure that someone is focusing on outdoor health and safety and ensuring all camping and Youth Protection guidelines. Lastly, we want to make sure that all packs understand that overnight camping is for registered Scouts and parents only. Siblings and non-Scouts are encouraged to come for the day.

### The Selection Process

We will be accepting applications between March 15 and March 31. Please contact the event leadership if there are issues meeting the submission timeframe. The leadership team will be meeting on April 3 to make the selections and we will be following up with units within the few days following. We will contact you regardless of selection so that you are aware and can plan to attend accordingly.
